

	Restorative Justice Facilitator
Position Description:	The Richmond Restorative Justice Program is a pre-charge diversion program primarily aimed at children and youth, who have come into conflict with the law. Restorative justice is a community-based alternative to the traditional justice system. Trained volunteers facilitate community justice forums (CJF), which bring together the victim, offender and their families and supporters for a discussion about the incident and how the harm can be repaired.

Responsibilities/Duties Include:	Interviewing Facilitation Writing Agreements and Summary Reports Attending Program Meetings and Events Participating in Training and Education workshops. Promotion and Advocacy for Restorative Justice.
Qualifications:	Excellent communication skills (Oral, written) Effective organization and time management skills Ability to work independently and as part of a team Ability to treat clients with objectivity, fairness and respect Previous experience with at-risk youth and/or conflict resolution an asset. Criminal Record Check required.
Commitment:	Volunteers are asked to commit up to 15 hours per month for a minimum of 12 months following acceptance into the program
Training:	3 days of community justice forum training from the Royal Canadian Mounted Police
Benefits	CJF Facilitator Accreditation Eligible for additional education and training (Crisis Prevention, First Aid).
